


2019 INCIDENT DISTRIBUTION PROFILE

EVFD MATTERS

JANUARY 2020 UPDATE



- 1) <u>STATION 42 REMODEL</u>: Contract signed by *Scout Lake Construction* on Friday, 09 January; ground breaking media extravaganza at 1000, Tuesday, 21 January. The remodel will be two-phase: Phase One = the west side; Phase Two = apparatus bays. Phase One demolition should begin this month.
- 2) EVFD STRATEGIC PLAN UPDATE: The EVFD Strategic Plan update Team is Commissioner Riel, Chief Emery, AD Huitt, Captains Evers and Babcock, Lieutenant Henle, and FF Stingley. As presented at multiple Tuesday Drills, the Team began with revisiting the EVFD Mission, Vision, and Values. A SWOT (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, and Weaknesses) survey was conducted, and feedback was distilled into 57 EVFD aspirations. These 57 aspirations were further distilled into 27 EVFD aspirations. All members were asked to select their preferred 25 aspirations from among the 27 and then select the five most important from among the 25. After collecting everybody's 25 and 5 and the final distillation will reveal our BIG FIVE goals for 2020. The BIG FIVE will then be prioritized by the Executive Team and presented to the BOFC for approval. If you haven't done so, please use the distributed documents provided to make your 25 and 5 selections.
- 3) EVFD RESPONSE STANDARDS TEAM: The EVFD Response Standards Team is Commissioner St. Mary, Chief Emery, Captain Lenseigne, Lieutenant McDonald, and FF Stingley. Criteria for development of EVAFD Response Standards (RCW, WAC, WSRB, NFPA) was discussed during the first meeting; the Team will meet again in January.

Among the performance measures of a *Standard of Response Coverage* is the establishment of 'specific performance measures applicable to response time objectives' (per RCW 52.30) and the determination of an EVFD 'effective response force.'

- 4) EVFD FIREFIGHTER ACADEMY: EVFD Firefighter Academy began Saturday, 04 January will finish with IFSAC Firefighter-I testing on May 23 and 24. All Saturdays are dedicated to developing and improving FF-I skills (and some knowledge). The majority of cognitive education will be completed using Target Solutions online modules. Eight members are attending the Academy: Jay Cruz, Scott Eier, Trevor Fink, Chris Foster, Shay Holmes, Aaron Livingston, James Scherchligt, and Travis Young. Thank you Captain Babcock for making the Academy happen! Mark your calendar: Graduation will be Friday, 12 June.
- 5) <u>STANDBY SHIFT BONUS</u>: A efficient way to obtain standby and response credit is to work shift-hours: day, night, weekend, holiday, anytime. Remember that a 'shift' is 4-consecutive hours in a fire station either working with the Station 40 on-duty crew or staffing Station 42 ready for immediate response.

4+1: FOUR-hours of shift stand-by provides ONE response credit. EIGHT-hours of shift standby provides a TWO response credits. Shift standby is an efficient way to earn participation credits. The 4+1 standby/ response credit also counts toward your State pension participation requirement. 'Standby' = minimum of four-hours in a fire station ready to respond. {For more information see WAC 491-03-030.}
