b. Discuss Wild Land Exercises, Prevention, Training

Lt Goldsmith presented information to the Board on MAWD (Multi-Agency Wildland Drill) and has invited SunComm and the media to observe the drill. BC Woodall would like to have a low intensity live burn training on May 15th in the same area that the Coyote Springs Fire burned last year. Safety for the public and firefighters is the main concern so if conditions are not right

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the burn will be cancelled (fuel moisture, winds, etc.). There will be resources staged incase anything gets out of hand. Fire watch will continue for several hours after 100% mop up is finished. The shift on duty will come back the next day to double check and BC Woodall also invited the Board to participate.

Mid-APRIL 2018 ACTIVITY SNAPSHOT

- 1. FDSOA Incident Safety Officer Certification Academy: This weekend, 28 and 29 April, at Station 40.
- ITAC Strategy and Tactics Clinic: Saturday, 30 June, and Sunday, 01 July, at Station 40 (co-Instructing
 with retired Seattle Fire Department Deputy Chief of Training and Safety Stewart Rose. (See
 attached flyer.) We are selling seats to offset EVFD cost; event posted in Daily Dispatch and flyers
 distributed to Yakima County Fire Chiefs and Yakima County Training Officers.
- 3. <u>Levy Preparation</u>: Voter information project begins in June (perhaps end of May); big voter information push mid–July to August election.
- 4. <u>Honorable Leadership</u>: Classes continue for each shift and at volunteer drill (4th Tuesdays = class delivered by Fire Chief).
- Beaudry/Bittner Connection: Tuesday, 17 April; myself, Commissioner Riel, and Lt. Schrank met with new County Engineer Matt Pietrusiewicz on 17 April to continue discussion of a Beaudry Road/Bittner Road connector. Requested a meeting with Representative Dave Taylor and County Commissioner Randy Elliott to discuss options and to consensus on a solution.
- 6. <u>Terrace Heights Community Association Meeting</u>: Thursday, 19 April; attended by myself and Lt. Schrank; provided brief 'state of the fire district' report. (Did not mention levy.)
- 7. <u>Terrace Heights Annual Clean-Up</u>: Saturday, 19 May (I will be instructing at the 95th annual *WSFFA Fire School and Conference* in Wenatchee; instructing as EVFD Fire Chief and compensated for travel expenses only).
- 8. <u>Collective Bargaining Agreement Preparation</u>: Preparing for upcoming collective bargaining; have requested an initial meeting to establish collective bargaining ground rules. Also collecting collective bargaining agreements for developing comparables that are accurate and germane.
- 9. Seasonal Crew: Begin work 01 May; still seeking a second member.

ON THE HORIZON

- Mission, Vision, Values: Management Team development will begin soon; periodic submittal to BOFC for review.
- 2. <u>Lieutenant Assessment Center</u>: November 2018; we recommend that EVFD contract with third-party provider to assure the process is unbiased, valid, and reliable; also recommend EVFD purchase a valid and reliable test banks from FIRE.TEST cognitive exam test question banks from *Performance Training Systems, Inc.*, in Florida. Their test item banks are used by numerous IFSAC Accredited agencies for Certification testing, including the WSP in Washington. Exams and quizzes will also be used on an ongoing basis for review, re-Certification, and initial Certification preparation. <u>Cost</u>: \$6,714.00 (Includes LXR-TEST, the test generation 'engine' where test bank questions are stored and is used to generate exams.)
