

OCTOBER INCIDENT DISTRIBUTION PROFILE



STATUS REPORT

- 1) <u>STATION 42</u>: Bid opening at 1510 on Monday, 02 December; bid review Tuesday and Wednesday; bid award at 1500 on Thursday, 05 December.
- 2) <u>RESPONSE TIME MATTERS!</u>: Just before noon, on 29 October, B-Shift responded to a Code 99 (cardiac arrest) adjacent to the hop fields on Birchfield (just North of Mieras). A 55 year old male arrested while driving a tractor which uncontrolled crossed Birchfield and struck a house on the west side of the road. Bystanders initiated CPR which was continued and augmented by EVFD and ambulance personnel. The patient awoke two days later at hospital and is out of intensive care.
- 3) STRATEGIC PLAN TEAM UPDATE: Myself and Captain Babcock met with PTP and shift members to present the Team's proposed Mission-Vision-Values and to capture their thoughts and ideas using the SWOT model (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, Threats). Once compiled these thoughts and ideas will be shared with the BOFC and integrated into the Strategic Plan process. Representing PTP members, FF Monty Stingley has volunteered to serve on the committee.
 Next Meeting: 05 December
- 4) RESPONSE STANDARDS TEAM UPDATE: The Team will use a standards-based approach, which will 25 ensure that EVFD Response Standards align with RCW, WAC, WSRB, and NFPA. The Team is comprised of Commissioner St. Mary, myself, Captain Lenseigne, Lt. McDonald, and FF Stingley. Purpose, goals, and timelines will be established during the second meeting.

- 6) <u>PTP MEMBER RESIGNATION</u>: Amy Lee submitted her resignation on 05 November.

ON THE HORIZON

EVFD PTP FIREFIGHTER ACADEMY: Captain Babcock has been busy preparing for our 2020 PTP
Firefighter Academy, which will begin mid-January and finish during May. Ten EVFD members have
expressed interest in attending. IFSAC Certification testing will be offered at some time soon after
the Academy concludes.

Rather than two evening classroom sessions each week, students will our *Target Solutions* subscription for the cognitive portion of the Academy (including post-session quizzing to verify learning transfer). Saturdays will be used for manipulative skill instruction and drills.

To comply with WSRB, the Academy will be at least 244-hours. If approved, the *Fire.Test* license subscription will be used for creating milestone exams (mid-term, final). WSP IFSAC skill test forms will be incorporated into the Academy. Both the *Fire.Test* exams in tandem with the WSP SkillTtest forms will prepare our members for IFSAC Certification testing.
