YAKIMA COUNTY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT 4 BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS REGULAR MEETING August 12th, 2019

The meeting convened at 4:00 pm at East Valley Fire Station 40. Chairman Riel called the meeting to order and conducted the pledge of allegiance.





JULY INCIDENT DISTRIBUTION PROFILE


